Projects that were awarded funding but did not move forward:

- **MIFA Victory Theatre Sconces (FY19):** \$100,000. Recipient did not achieve full funding within required time period.
- **123 Pine Street Affordable Housing (FY19)** \$120,000. Recipient was unable to secure historic tax credits to make the project viable.
- **43 N. Canal Street Exterior Restoration (FY19)** 32,000. Recipient unwilling to accept Preservation Restriction.
- **Armour and Co Exterior Restoration (FY20):** \$90,000. Recipient wanted to diverge from restrictions required.
- **Rock Valley Cemetery Obelisk (FY21)** 3,000. Need for crane exceeded possible award amount under the Small Grants process.
